

### **COURSE OVERVIEW**

*PCP-100, Professional Prep*, will be delivered in the classroom and on the road in an ambulance simulator. PCP-100 will provide the necessary tools and coaching to help OLS Academy graduates become more employable by industry. The students will receive coaching in the areas of driving, interviewing in front of a panel, licensing exam writing, and situational scenario testing.

Specific topics include: CEVO – Emergency Vehicle Operations, research methods, Basic Life Support, Community Paramedicine, the hiring process, and licensing exam prep.
